It will be exceedingly difficult to walk away from this way of life and saying goodbye to all my work friends. Only health care workers can understand the relationships that are created as we stand next to each other taking care of extremely sick

patients.

I am looking forward to my new way of life. I am most looking forward to family holidays, birthdays, special events, and getting to eat meals at regular times. I also plan to spend my time golfing, shooting sports, traveling, and taking vacations. I will be ecstatic to be able to drink my morning coffee outside instead of on my way to work. Instead of wondering what the weather will be like for flying, I will only question. "Will the rain interfere with my pool time?"

May 31,2020, I retire and will pass the torch on to those behind me. Lutheran Air has been my love and my home. Stay vigilant, keep learning, and stay above the bar because Lutheran Air is a great program and family to work with. This is not just a job. Love what you do, and you will never work another day.

### INDIANA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

Ms. Katie Hokanson reported that the decision was made to move the Medical Director's conference will be a virtual platform this year instead of in person. Ms. Hokanson reported that at the end of May Methodist Northlake in Gary voluntarily decided not to continue being a trauma center, so it is no longer a level III trauma center. Also Terra Haute Regional will be dropping from a level II to a level III trauma center as of August 1st. There will be letters sent to all of the EMS providers to let them know about the change. Commissioner Bowman asked if we had a reason why they downgraded. Ms. Hokanson stated that it was based on the cost.

Ms. Margo Knefelkamp stated that they are still working on the PECC training. The data clean up from the survey is under way. They are still working on the Hands Heavy conference more details to come. Ms. Knefelkamp also stated that the progress report is underway.

### INDIANA FIRE CHIEF'S ASSOCIATION

Mr. Doug Randall reported that the IERC conference has been postponed. They have secured the same keynote speakers for next year. Mr. Randall also announced the Indiana Fire Chief's Association is in support of the mechanical CPR devices for the EMR level.

### **COVID -19 BRIEFING**

Dr. Michael Kaufmann discussed the IDHS COVID-19 manual. He encourages people to download it for a resource. Data is being collected. They are looking at an easier way to report it as a Covid case. They are working on a county by county dashboard. Dr. Kaufmann thanked everyone for their work and for reporting their data. EMS data is a key factor in tracking COVID. Dr. Kaufmann encourages everyone to continue to follow CDC guidelines regarding PPE.

### STATE EMS DIRECTORS REPORT -

Director Kinney talked briefly about the goals he has set for staff and himself. One of the goals he has set for himself is to develop LMS training for people in new official roles. Tony will be out auditing one class per month as well as being more active in Training Institution audits. Field staff will be out in the field more. Direct Kinney reminded everyone that IERC has been cancelled. He also reported that he is working on a grant that will help build LMS content that will be available through Acadis. Anyone that has suggestions for the LMS content or has a training they would like to donate please let us know. We have been given a sub-grant for \$100,000 he is working on finalizing the plan and budget for the sub-grant. Director Kinney discussed the change of BLS non transporting agencies reporting directly into ImageTrend to the worksheet for documenting runs in ImageTrend. There will be an Acadis outage on Sunday July 12 from 8am – 12 noon.

<u>STATE MEDICAL DIRECTORS REPORT</u> - Dr. Michael Kaufmann briefly talked about house bill 1209. Dr. Kaufmann talked about the white paper for an interfacility system that he and some of his colleagues are working on. Dr. Kaufmann reported the IHI continues to move forward.

<u>CHAIRMAN'S REPORT AND DIRECTION</u>- Chairman Turpen announced that several conferences have been cancelled. The EAGLES conference is currently scheduled for January in Huston Texas. EAGLES is a very good evidence-based medicine conference. Now is the time to examine your own systems and response protocols and how they work with all the changes that have been made recently. Please be sure to check on your people not just physically but on their metal well-being.
