Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA)

Job Description

This program prepares medical assistant students for the NHA exam (included) and for performing patient clinical skills in the medical office setting. Students will learn how to perform clinical procedures including administering medications, assisting with minor surgery, performing an electrocardiogram, obtaining laboratory specimens for testing, educating patients, and maintaining clinical equipment in an ambulatory care setting. Medical assistants perform routine clinical tasks to keep the offices of physicians, podiatrists, chiropractors, and optometrists running smoothly.

Upon successful completion of the Clinical Medical Assistant program a CCMA will have the skills necessary to gain employment in a number of capacities. Job opportunities will be prevalent in physicians' offices, clinics, chiropractors' offices and outpatient
